I remember feeling surprised when the suction caps were removed because it seemed like the test was finished quickly.

So far my eyes have been checked, some blood has been taken, and I've been given an X-ray and EKG. The doctors here still haven't given me any prescriptions and my interview with the doctor hasn't been conducted yet either.

This health check is taking a really long time. I thought it would only take one hour or so, but it's already taken over three hours. I hope I will be allowed to go home soon, because I'm sick of waiting.
